

AGM HIGHLIGHTS 2016

The Canadian Association of Hospital Dentists - Association canadienne des dentistes en milieu hospitalier (CAHD - ACDH) held its second annual meeting at Dalhousie University in Halifax on May 13, 2016. The following report highlights discussions and outcomes from the meeting.

1. First year goals and accomplishments

The 2016 CAHD Annual Report was reviewed. Over the past year, the CAHD website was launched; CAHD has investigated and implemented the National Match Service (NMS) for Canadian General Practice Residents; and the Association has taken a leadership role in Antimicrobial Stewardship in Canadian Dentistry.

2. National Match Service for Canadian GPR Programs

Dr. Makhoul steered this process and represents CAHD on the Match Committee of the Special Care in Dentistry Association (SCDA), one of the Sponsoring Organizations of the NMS Steering Committee. All but one Canadian GPR Program has decided to participate in the postdoctoral dental matching program of the NMS. Dr. Makhoul advised that the NMS has sent programs their Institution Agreements and recommended that program directors meet with their university counterparts to ensure complete and accurate communication to respective applicants.

A panel presentation was given on the topic "Importance of registries and databases in clinical practice and research". Speakers included:

In this session, the speakers demonstrated the importance and value of registry building in clinical practice and research. The introductory talk by Dr. Rousseau described different types of registries and databases, defined their desirable features, and addressed some of the pitfalls to be avoided. Examples of the uses and usefulness of registries from diverse perspectives and fields of application were provided, for instance in quality assurance, outcomes research, quality of care improvement, and healthcare systems management. This talk was followed by a description of concrete applications in the Canadian setting. Dr. Rousseau presented the case of a pilot study on potentially malignant oral lesions which led to the conception of a registry to facilitate future recruitment for clinical and epidemiological studies. Dr. Makhoul described his experience building an online webbased registry at the McGill University Health Centre for quality assurance in the delivery of

oral cancer surgical care. Lastly, Dr. Wood presented on the extensive patient databases created and maintained by the Oral Oncology Group at Princess Margaret Hospital.

5. Election of Directors and Appointment of Officers
